WHAT IF I JUST WORK ON MY OWN?

Experience shows that even the most passionate man can accomplish little if he is not part of a cause and a system greater than himself. As long as everyone goes about individually, trying to remake the wheel, we are easily frustrated and defeated. The Legion takes faithful Catholics and binds them into an army, magnifying their work.

HOW DO I JOIN?

The individual group of the Legion is called a Praesidium. Contact the parishes in your area to find where the closest Praesidia are, then just show up at the meeting time. If there aren't any nearby, talk to your pastor about starting one.

DOES IT MATTER WHAT PARISH?

The Legion system works best at more traditional parishes, because it is designed for Catholics who already know and love their faith, but it is the same system, the same handbook, at every parish. It is non-liturgical, so you can join your local Praesidium even if you go to the Traditional Mass at a different parish.

WHAT IS THE LEGION OF MARY?

The Legion of Mary is an Association of Catholics who, with the sanction of the Church and under the powerful leadership of Mary Immaculate, Mediatrix of all Graces (who is fair as the moon, bright as the sun, and — to Satan and his legionaries — terrible as an army set in battle array), have formed themselves into a Legion for service in the warfare which is perpetually waged by the Church against the world and its evil powers.

IS THIS SOME NEW PROGRAM?

No. The Legion was started by Frank Duff in 1921. It grew up, spread, and matured entirely before the Second Vatican Council (1962). It is based on solid theology: that all men must join the Catholic Church to be saved; that Mary's importance to our salvation must not be understated, much less pushed to the background; that every Catholic must know, love, and share his faith.

DID IT GET 'MODERNIZED' LIKE OTHER CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS?

No. The 1953 handbook is virtually the same as one currently in use. In fact, it condemns 'modernizers' who wish to keep the name but change the substance, who attempt to pervert and destroy all that is good and holy from the inside.

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WHAT DOES THE LEGION DO?

Legionaries go out every week, two by two, to convert non-Catholics, to recover those who have fallen away, and to strengthen the faithful. They go door to door, go out to busy public places, in order to engage people in thoughtful, loving, and challenging conversations about the faith. The legionary approaches every soul as Mary would, with her great kindness and generosity, as well as her firm and uncompromising faith. They also visit the sick and dying, teach the faith to Catholics, and promote Marian devotion.

WHAT IS REQUIRED OF A MEMBER?

The legionary attends a weekly meeting, lasting an hour and a half, says a prayer every day, and does about two hours of evangelizing work every week.

WHY IS THE MEETING WEEKLY?

Unlike modern programs, the Legion system has been used successfully all across the world for over one hundred years. The meeting is necessary to keep the members on task: praying, studying, and doing their work. The Legion is an army, and requires of its soldiers sacrifice, obedience, and unity. The meeting is crucial to this discipline. Every legionary gives a report on his work at the meeting and takes a new assignment for the coming week.

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
